The **National Cadet Corps (NCC)** is the youth wing of the Indian Armed Forces, headquartered in New Delhi, India. It is a tri-services organization, comprising the Army, Navy, and Air Force, engaged in grooming the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizens.

Motto: "Unity and Discipline"

The NCC aims at developing character, comradeship, discipline, a secular outlook, the spirit of adventure, and ideals of selfless service amongst young citizens.

Aims of NCC

1. **Character Building:** To develop qualities of character, courage, comradeship, discipline, leadership, spirit of adventure, and the ideals of selfless service among the youth.
2. **Leadership:** To create a human resource of organized, trained, and motivated youth to provide leadership in all walks of life.
3. **National Service:** To provide a suitable environment to motivate the youth to take up a career in the Armed Forces.

Training Activities

Cadets undergo a variety of training modules designed to test their physical and mental endurance:

- **Institutional Training:** Drill, weapon training, map reading, and field craft.
 - **Camp Training:** Participation in Annual Training Camps (ATC), National Integration Camps (NIC), and the prestigious Republic Day Camp (RDC).
 - **Social Service:** Involvement in Blood Donation drives, Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, and disaster relief operations.
 - **Adventure Training:** Trekking, mountaineering, parasailing, and water sports.

Certifications and Benefits

The NCC training program is spread over three years, leading to the following certifications:

- **'B' Certificate:** Earned after two years of training and attending one camp.
- **'C' Certificate:** The highest level, earned after three years of training and attending two camps.

Why Join NCC?

- **Incentives in Armed Forces:** Special entry schemes (no UPSC written exam) for 'C' certificate holders in the Army, Navy, and Air Force.
 - **Academic Weightage:** Many universities provide additional marks/grace marks to NCC cadets.
 - **Government Jobs:** Preference in State and Central Police forces and Para-military forces.
 - **Personality Development:** Enhances public speaking, confidence, and time management.

How to Apply

Interested candidates should apply directly through the **Associate NCC Officer (ANO)** of the college. Keep an eye on the college notice board for the official recruitment notification, typically released in July or August.

Selection Criteria

The selection process is rigorous and includes physical tests and an interview. The **Commanding Officer (CO)** of the concerned unit personally oversees the final selection to ensure the most capable candidates are chosen for the wing.

Documents Required

Candidates must bring the following documents (original and photocopies) at the time of selection:

- **College Admission:** Fee receipt of current college admission.
- **Educational Proof:** Plus 2 (+2) Certificate.
- **Identification:** Copy of Aadhar Card.
- **Financial Record:** Copy of Bank Account Passbook.
- **Achievements:** Any document/certificate of participation in **Sports, Cultural activities, or NCC (Junior Division)** at the school level.

Enrollment Statistics & Present Strength

Government Degree College Banjar enrolls cadets under the **Open Vacancy Scheme**. This scheme allows for a diverse intake of students who are passionate about national service and discipline.

The total strength of the cadets is subject to change annually based on the specific vacancies allotted to the college by the unit headquarters.
