Sir, now with your kind permission I would like to present a resume of the activities of this college during the academic session 2016-17.

Introduction:

Surrounded by the beautiful hills, the solitary and serene location of Government Degree College, Banjar provides a favourable environment for teaching and learning. This college came into existence on 19 May 1999 with sustained efforts of Hon'ble Sh. Karan Singh Ji, the then MLA of Banjar. This initiated a long journey with a vision and objective of providing a 'congenial environment for the pursuit of quality higher education with commitment to inculcate the values of humanism, patriotism and scientific temper' among students. Although it started functioning with only 84 students and five lecturers but the strength of students has grown to 1179 in the current academic session 2016-17. At present there are 20 members of teaching and 8 members of non-teaching staff in the college. The college not only caters to the needs of the students belonging to the inner and the outer Seraj but also the adjoining areas of Mandi District. It has a big building of Arts block equipped with laboratories, a seminar hall, an IT lab and an established library. To maintain quality of higher education an Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) has also been constituted as per the guidelines of UGC.

Apart from imparting higher education in various disciplines this institution takes keen interest in promoting Sports, N.S.S., Ranger and Rovers and Cultural activities for the overall personality development of the students. The college has provided scholarships, computer-

internet facilities and canteen facilities to the students. To instill creativity and writing skills among the students, the college regularly publishes its annual magazine 'Seraj Shikha'.

Enrolment:

The total strength of the college during the academic session 2016-17 is 1179 including 574 boys and 605 girls. The details of category-wise enrolment of students are given in Table -1.

Achievements:

Sports:

Students of the college show tremendous zeal and interest in sports activities. College teams participated in various Inter-college competitions such as Badminton Championship (Men and Women) held at G.D.C. Mandi w.e.f. 14 to 17 September 2016; Volley ball Championship (Men Section) held at Government College Nerwa from 20 to 23 September 2016; Basketball Championship held at Government College Nalagarh from 3 to 7 October 2016, Boxing Championship (Men and Women) held at Saraswati Nagar Shimla from 4 to 8 October 2016 and Table Tennis (Men and Women) held at Centre of Excellence Shimla from 8 to 10 December 2016.

- Hira Devi and Rubeena of B.A.-V Semester won **Silver and Bronze Medal** respectively in Inter-college Boxing Championship held at Saraswati Nagar Shimla.
- The college Table Tennis team (Women) comprising of Anuja, Manisha, Hem Lata and Prasanna secured **third position** in H. P. University Inter-college Table Tennis Championship held at Centre of Excellence Shimla and Ms. Anuja was selected for Inter University Championship.

Annual Sports Activities were organized on 8 March 2017 in which around 200 students participated. The students took part in various track and field events and tested their strength and stamina. Mr. Diwan Chand of II semester and Ms. Heena of II semester were selected the best athlete among boys and girls section respectively. Mr. Diwan Chand got first position in 200 metres race and third position in long jump whereas Ms. Heena secured first position in 200 and 800 metres race and first position in shot put.

Cultural and Co-Curricular Activities:

- ❖ Our college teams participated in H. P. University Youth Festival Group-I at Government College Ghumarwin w.e.f. 28 to 31 August 2016; Group-II at

Government College Dehri w.e.f. 24 to 27 September 2016 and Group-III at Government College Rampur w.e.f. 17 to 20 September 2016.

- ❖ Six students of the college also participated in state level Hindi Divas organized by the Department of Language and Culture Himachal Pradesh from 11 to 14 September 2016 in which Ms. Chinta Devi was able to bag **first prize** in Essay Writing Competition.

Celebration of Freedom Fortnight:

The college had involved its teachers and students in various activities to celebrate 'Azadi 70- Yad Karo Kurbanī Freedom Fortnight'. Plantation drive, cultural function, *Tiranga Yatra* and mass recitation of National Anthem were organized by the college during that fortnight.

- The events started with Mass Plantation Drive on 9 August 2016 which was organized with the help Eco Club, NSS Volunteers and other students of the college. Various species of medicinal and ornamental saplings were planted around the college campus.
- *Sadbhawana Divas* was celebrated on 20 August 2016. The Principal of the college administered oath to teaching and non teaching staff and the students of the college.
- It was followed by Cultural function. Various activities held on this occasion were discussions on Freedom struggle and patriotism, patriotic songs, slogan writing, solo and group songs and poster making.
- '*Tiranga Yatra*' was organized on 22 August 2016 to mark the occasion of 70th Independence Day. The march was flagged off from college campus. Students and teachers traversed a distance of 5 kilometers through the main market and concluded the march back in the campus.
- The Fortnight ended with Mass recitation of National Anthem on 23 August 2016 at 11.00 AM in the college campus.

Special lecture on Anti Ragging

SHO Banjar delivered a lecture on Anti Ragging and drug de-addiction on 16 August 2016.

Special lecture on Drug Abuse

Under the leadership of Chief Judicial Magistrate Kullu a team comprising of doctors and lawyers paid a visit to this institution on 28 September 2016 and appraised the teachers and

students about drug abuse and its ill effects along with legal implications. Ms. Kanta Verma (CJM), Dr. Abhinav Sharma, Mr. Baldev Singh Thakur and Mr. Dola Singh delivered lectures on this occasion.

Activities of the Subject Societies:

Department of Economics organized a special lecture for the students of Economics and Commerce on “**Consumer Awareness about Penetration of imitated Brands and Fake Products in the Rural Market**” on 23 September 2016. This was conducted by a survey team from Center for Consumer Studies, Indian Institute of Public Administration, New Delhi. Mr. Pankaj Kumar Singh, Mr. Virendra Nath Mishra, Mr. Ashutosh Dixit and Mr. Mohit Kumar Gautam were members of the team. The objective of their visit was to conduct Survey on “Awareness of Fake Products in Rural Markets: A framework for Consumer Protection” in Kullu District. Dr. Ratnesh Tripathi stressed on the necessity of making people aware about this Act to fight against corrupt practices of the traders or service providers. He also stressed on the problems faced by the economy due to black marketing. Mr. Virendra Nath Mishra, Research Officer, Center for Consumer Studies, IIPA delivered special lecture on various aspects of Consumer Protection & Empowerment, Consumer Education and Awareness: Policies and Programmes, Role of Helplines in Redressal of Consumer Grievances, Consumer Protection Act and Working of Redressal Agencies and Food Safety. A questionnaire was circulated among the students by IIPA survey team to assess their level of awareness about brand imitational and fake products being sold in the market.

Economics Society also organized a guest lecture on 1 October 2016 by Dr. Adrash Dhawan on ‘**GST and Make in India**’. The speaker focused on Taxation system and its necessity. He also stressed on the merits and demerits of taxation system.

Department of Geography organized a workshop on ‘**Basics of Geographic Information System (GIS)**’ on 5 October 2016. The workshop was facilitated by Dr. Renuka Thapliyal, Associate Prof. of Geography and Dr. J.C. Kuniyal, Scientist-F & Theme Head Environmental Assessment and Management & Environmental Governance and Policy, G. B. Pant National Institute of Himalayan Environment & Sustainable Development. It was designed to provide basic knowledge of GIS and Remote Sensing which has recently evolved as an integrating field of study and helpful in shaping careers.

Literary Society (Department of English, Hindi and Sanskrit)

The college Literary Society organized its annual function on 5 September 2016 on the occasion of Teachers' Day. The purpose of Literary Society is to unleash the creative talents of the students. On this occasion various competitions like Declamation, Quiz, Poetry recitation and Poster making were organized. Dr. Ratnesh Tripathi, Assistant Professor of Economics recited his self- composed poem titled "*Paharon ki Chaya*".

NSS (National Service Scheme):

During the session 2016-17 a total of 100 students were enrolled in NSS. Various activities were carried out under the leadership of Programme Officer Dr. Joginder Singh Thakur.

- Ms. Jyoti Thakur of V Semester and Mr. Lokesh Thakur of III Semester attended National Integration Camp at Agra from 13 to 19 June 2016.
- Four students of Government College Banjar (Lucky Thakur, Rajesh Rana, Babli Devi and Biju Devi of VI Semester) participated in State Level N.S.S. Mega Camp organized at Government College Anni w.e.f. 26 September to 2 October 2016.
- NSS day was observed on 24 September 2016. As many as 70 NSS volunteers, students and staff members of the College enthusiastically participated in the function. In this programme NSS volunteers presented NSS song, patriotic song, group song and Pahari song. Dr. Yog Raj highlighted the importance of NSS and its activities. Principal of the College, Dr. Naresh Sharma in his concluding address congratulated and appreciated the efforts made by NSS volunteers in making the programme a grand success.
- Under special activities, 7 days special camp was organized w.e.f. 19 to 25 December 2016 in the college campus in which 50 students participated. NSS unit of our college adopted Bhumar village of Balagad panchayat for development and awareness activities for the session 2016-17. During this camp the main stress was on physical work, awareness programmes and personality development of students. The volunteers repaired footpaths and cleaned drains. Some lectures were also delivered by the college teachers on current issues. DFO Banjar Mr. Patel, Advocate Mr. Baldev Thakur and Mr. Ramesh Chand were also invited to deliver special lectures on sensitive issues.

Library:

The library has >5000 books having a collection of both text and reference books. Latest subject books, magazines and newspapers have been subscribed for the library. There is always an effort to purchase the latest editions of books to update the knowledge of students in various subjects. The library at present subscribes twelve magazines, three journals and four newspapers. More magazines, news papers and journals will be subscribed in the coming academic session for the benefit of the students. The facilities of computer and printer are also available to the students. For current affairs and competitive preparations there are subscriptions of twelve magazines such as Pratiyogita Sansar, Competition Refresher, Pratiyogita Darpan, Front Line, India Today, Yojna, Competition Success Review, Readers Digest, Sarita, Biology Today, Mathematics Today, Chemistry Today, Physics Today, Vigyan Pragati and Vani Prakashan. The library has subscription of both Hindi and English Newspapers.

College Magazine:

The college publishes its own magazine 'Seraj Sikha' which consists of English, Hindi, Sanskrit, Science, Commerce and Pahari sections. This year also the new issue of the college magazine was published and its copies were distributed to the students. Dr. Binta Thakur is

the Chief Editor of this magazine and the other members in the editorial board for this session are stated in Table-3.

Information Technology Lab:

The college has a well established IT Lab having projector facility and 24 computer systems with internet connectivity. This lab is being used to enhance computer skills of the college students under the supervision of Dr. Yog Raj (Assistant Professor of Public Administration) successfully and effectively. During the academic session 2016-2017 classes were conducted in this lab by all the three faculties of this college. Power point presentations are being made in IT Lab by different faculties for the benefit of the students. Students are also benefited by online facilities provided by this lab for filling up of examination and scholarship forms. During this academic session IT Lab facility will be extended to more students to equip them with computer skills.

IGNOU:

The study centre of IGNOU has been functioning in this college since 2008. It started functioning with only 9 students and at present the strength has grown to 580. Mr. Tej Singh Verma is the co-ordinator of this study centre. The centre provides mainstream graduation and post graduation degrees and many certificate and diploma programmes. The programmes covered are B.A., B.T.S., B.Com., M.Com. and M.A. in English, Hindi, Sociology, Political Science, Public Administration and Economics. Some of the certificate and diploma courses

are- Tourism and Environment, Disaster Management, Nutrition and Health Education, Early Child Care & Education, Women Empowerment, Creative Writing in English, Environment Study, Human Rights, Rural Development, Functional English and Consumer Protection.

PTA:
