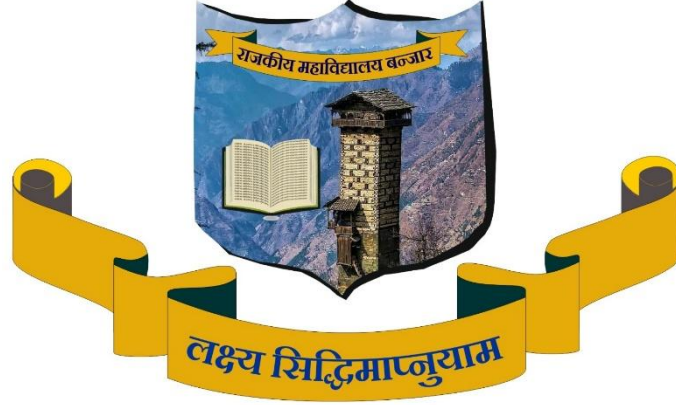

Government Utkrisht Mahavidyalaya Banjar (GDC Banjar) is a leading institution of higher education situated in the scenic Banjar Valley of Kullu district, Himachal Pradesh. Established in 1999, the college has emerged as an important academic hub for students from Banjar, Tirthan Valley, Seraj region, and adjoining rural areas. Affiliated to Sardar Patel University, Mandi, and accredited by NAAC with a 'B' grade, the college is committed to delivering quality, inclusive, and value-based education in a calm and inspiring Himalayan environment.

The campus of GDC Banjar, located along the banks of the Tirthan River, provides an ideal atmosphere for teaching and learning. The college offers undergraduate programmes in **Arts, Science, and Commerce** streams under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and in alignment with the National Education Policy. Over the years, student enrolment has shown steady growth, with significant participation and academic excellence among girl students, reflecting the institution's contribution to women empowerment and social development in the region.

In terms of infrastructure, the college has benefited from various government initiatives such as RUSA and the Utkrisht Mahavidyalaya Scheme. As per the need of different groups of students <p>The college adopts a student-centric and outcome-based teaching-learning approach through a combination of blended learning, flipped classroom methodology, and need-based teaching strategies tailored to different groups of students.</p> <p>The institution is affiliated with Sardar Patel University (SPU), Mandi, and strictly follows the Annual Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) under RUSA as approved by the university. The Timetable Committee prepares the academic timetable in accordance with university norms, ensuring appropriate distribution of theory classes, tutorials, and practical sessions for effective curriculum delivery.</p> <p>At the beginning of each academic session, class teachers clearly communicate the curriculum objectives, Course Outcomes (COs), and Program Outcomes (POs) to students. These outcomes are revisited during regular classes and special mentoring sessions. Teaching-learning activities extend beyond traditional classroom instruction and include various enrichment and experiential learning activities.</p> <p>The institution emphasizes interactive, innovative, and ICT-enabled teaching practices wherever appropriate. Significant efforts have been made to strengthen ICT infrastructure and enhance faculty competency through ICT training programs. The college has established ICT-enabled e-classrooms in select laboratories and departments. The IT Lab, Research Centre, Conference Hall, Language Laboratory, and Multipurpose Hall are equipped with modern ICT tools to support academic, research, career-counseling, and online learning activities. An interactive panel, provided by the Department of Higher Education, further strengthens career-guidance initiatives. The campus is supported by a fully functional Wi-Fi facility, and faculty members effectively use WhatsApp groups for sharing e-content and academic updates.</p> <p>Teaching strategies are also customized to meet the needs of diverse learner groups through demonstrations using models, charts, group discussions, and peer learning techniques. The flipped classroom model is employed in selected courses to promote self-learning and active classroom engagement.</p> <p>Tutorials and continuous internal assessments are integral to the teaching-learning process and help identify students' learning difficulties and special needs. Assignments, project work, presentations, practical examinations, class tests, and mid-term examinations are systematically used to assess course-specific and program-specific outcomes. Performance feedback is discussed with students, and internal assessment scores are thoroughly reviewed at the departmental level before final submission.</p> <p>The college library is well-equipped with books, journals, and digital resources, ensuring adequate academic support for students and faculty.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. 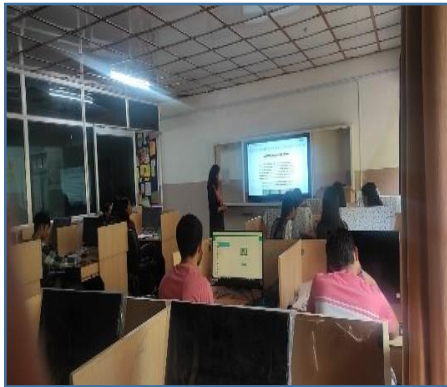

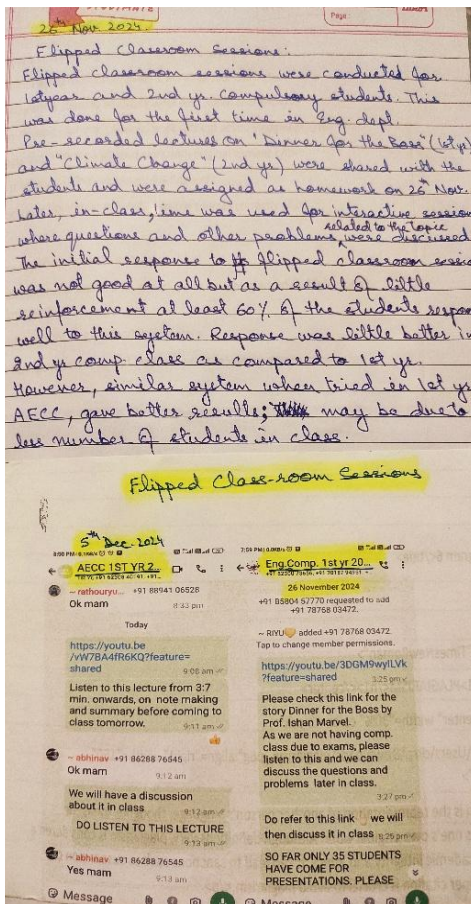

Field Visit Report: Life Science Students' Exploration of the Great Himalayan National Park

Introduction

A field visit to the Great Himalayan National Park (GHNP), Tirthan Valley, Banjar Subdivision was organized on 05/11/2024 by GDC Banjar headed by Prof. Rajeev Parmar (Dotary) for life science students to provide them with firsthand experience in understanding biodiversity, ecological balance, and conservation efforts in a natural habitat. The visit aimed to supplement classroom learning by exposing students to the park's unique ecosystem and the challenges it faces.



Objectives of the Visit

- To study the diverse flora and fauna of the GHNP.
- To understand the ecological significance of the park.
- To observe the conservation practices and challenges in maintaining a protected area.
- To learn about the role of local communities in park management.

Observations and Findings

- Biodiversity Hotspot:** The students were able to witness the rich biodiversity of the GHNP, including a variety of plant species (alpine meadows, coniferous forests) and fauna (various bird species, and signs of mammals like deer).

iii. Rainwater harvesting and its use for gardening and cleanliness: A rain water storage tank was constructed in the college campus in the year 2023. The capacity of the tank is 5000 liters. The water stored in the tank is utilized for tending the plants and cleaning the campus from time to time. This initiative not only save precious water resources but also maintains the lush greenery of the campus, enhancing its aesthetic appeal.

iv. Plastic free campus: A drive has been initiated in the year 2023 to make the students aware of the harms caused by single use plastic. The students are being encouraged to minimize the use of plastic by restricting themselves from buying

single use plastic and reusing plastic products to minimize the waste. The encourages for alternatives like cloth bags and reusable containers/materials. Students and staff are regularly sensitized to the harmful impact of plastic on the environment and animals. Making this initiative an integral part of the college green campus policy.

v. Blood donation camps: In addition to its environmental protection efforts, the college also takes active participation in many social welfare activities such as organizing blood donation camps. Students and staff voluntarily participate and the collected blood is donated to local hospital blood bank, thereby helping patient in need and fostering a speed of community service. Two Blood donation camps were organized during the session 2024-25.

First blood donation camp was organized by Red Ribbon Club, NCC, OSA and NSS unit of the college in collaboration with Punjab Kesari in memory of Birth Anniversary of Shaheed Lala Jagat Narayan on dated 09-09-2024. In this camp 39students/staff and others donated the blood.

Second Blood donations camp was organized by NSS in collaboration with district Red Cross Society, District Hospital Kullu on dated 20.02.2025. In this camp 4 unit of blood was donated.



vi. Adoption of villages/education institution: The college extends its social outreach by adopting nearby villages and educational institutional. Under this initiative students and faculty engage in various activities such as cleanliness drive, educational support, environmental awareness programs and health awareness activities, etc. The NSS unit of college has adopted Shilh village where various activities such as cleanliness drives, plantation and awareness campaigns are conducted by the volunteers from time to time. Further, The Rovers and Rangers wing of the college has adopted the Central Primary

School, Banjar. Under the guidance of Dr. Hemlata, A.P., and Mr. Hemendra, A.P., the Rovers and Rangers engaged with the students and staff, sharing academic knowledge and other valuable experiences. They also assured ongoing academic and other forms of support to both the students and the school staff, fostering community engagement and holistic development.



3. **Social Impact of extension activities (on the basis of community feedback):** Extension activities aim at continuously educating the local people of the society through awareness programs and inspiring them to contribute towards a cause. The spirit of extension activities works through sustained community interaction and link between the students and the community. The social impact of these extension activities is reflected on the overall personality development of the students as they emerge as confident and compassionate human beings and feel a sense of responsibility towards society and the environment as a whole. These activities strengthen their value system and instead of wasting time, they get engaged in creative and social activities such as plantation drives, shrumdaan, cleanliness drives, awareness campaigns etc., which further enhance their personalities. An increased sense of civic responsibility and volunteerism is seen among the students who are involved in various extension activities. These activities make students understand the importance of participating in community extension and enhance their knowledge and skills. **Documents attached in the end of this criteria.**

4. **Special New Innovative Initiatives or Ideas Adopted in the College:**
 1. **Swachhata Hi Seva Hai:**
 Under the National Drive, the NSS Unit of Banjar College organized a cleanliness campaign from 17/09/2024 to 02/10/2024 in the adopted village Shilah, as well as at the new and old Bus Stand Banjar, Sabji Mandi Banjar, Mela Ground Banjar, and various areas of the Banjar market. During this campaign, the volunteers collected 450 kg of plastic waste and bottles. This remarkable initiative by the NSS Unit of Banjar College was specially appreciated by the Ministry of Youth and Sports Affairs, Government of India, and was featured twice on their official Facebook and Instagram accounts.

2. Bhatiya Nadiyan Sanskriti Ki Janani:

The cadets of the NCC and the Rovers & Rangers Unit of GDC Banjar launched a River Bank Cleanliness Drive on 29/09/2024. In this initiative, 39 NCC cadets and 20 Rovers & Rangers volunteers collected garbage and plastic waste from the banks of the nearby rivers (Khadagad Khad). In addition, the NCC Unit of the college organized a program on **Swabhav Swachhata and Sanskaar Swachhata** to promote environmental protection and awareness.



3. **Plantation Drive:** The NSS, NCC, and Rovers & Rangers units of the college jointly organized a Plantation Drive on dated 28th, 29th August 2024 and 23rd February 2025 to promote environmental conservation and greenery in the campus and surrounding areas. 4. **Anti-Drug Awareness Campaign:** The college organized an Anti-Drug Awareness Campaign on dated 22/11/2024 in collaboration with the Police Department, Banjar, to spread awareness about the harmful effects of drug abuse. NSS, NCC, and Rovers & Rangers volunteers actively participated in rallies, awareness talks, and community outreach activities. As a key highlight of the campaign, students performed Nukkad Natak at Old Bus Stand Banjar to convey a strong message against substance abuse. Officers from the Police Department addressed the participants and discussed the legal, social, and health-related consequences of drug addiction. Informative posters and pamphlets were distributed across the campus and nearby areas. Students also took a pledge to remain drug-free and motivate others to adopt a healthy lifestyle. The campaign aimed to promote a safe, responsible, and drug-free community.



5. **Cyber Suraksha Abhiyan: Protecting Youth in the Digital Age:** The NSS unit of college organized a Cyber Suraksha Abhiyan in collaboration with the Banjar Police to raise awareness about safe and responsible digital practices on dated 04/12/2024. SHO Banjar police and experts from the cyber cell Sh. Desh Raj, along with trained police personnel and faculty members, conducted interactive sessions on cyber threats such as phishing, online fraud, identity theft, and cyberbullying. Students also performed Nukkad Natak in the college campus and at the Old Bus Stand Banjar to spread strong awareness about cyber safety among the community. As part of the campaign, a group of college students visited the Banjar Police Station to understand the practical working of cybercrime investigation and reporting procedures. They were further guided on creating strong passwords, identifying suspicious links, and safeguarding personal data on social media. Real-life case studies and demonstrations on secure browsing helped participants understand the seriousness of cybercrimes. The initiative aimed to equip students with essential cyber safety skills and foster a secure and alert digital environment within the college community.



6. **Agni Suraksha and Disaster Preparedness: Ensuring Safety in Banjar:** In response to the recent fire incidents in the Banjar area, the college organized an Agni Suraksha and Disaster Preparedness Drive to raise awareness about fire safety and emergency management on dated 16/12/2024. The program was conducted in collaboration with the Banjar Fire Department and local authorities. Students and faculty were trained on fire prevention techniques, use of fire extinguishers, and safe evacuation procedures during emergencies. Demonstrations and mock drills were held to give hands-on experience in handling fire and other disaster situations. Informative sessions also covered first aid, risk assessment, and community safety measures. Volunteers conducted awareness campaigns in the campus and nearby areas, emphasizing the importance of vigilance and preparedness. This initiative aimed to equip students and the community with life-saving knowledge and create a safer environment in Banjar.
