Code of Conduct for the Principal, faculty and students

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE PRINCIPAL

- 1) The Principal is the Head of the institution so he/she has to run it in an impartial, just and fair manner.
- 2) The Principal should be punctual, sincere toward his duties.
- 3) He/she should not discriminate against any employee, teaching or non-teaching. The Principal should have an open mind and be respective to suggestions from colleagues.
- 4) The Principal should carry out the instructions issued by the higher authorities in totality, both in letter
- 5) The Principal has to look after the welfare of the staff and students. He/she should never have a
- 6) The Principal should always act according to his/her logic and reasoning and not be influenced by tales
- 7) The Principal must run the institution strictly but tempered with care and affection.

Code of Professional Ethics for Teachers

The teachers are constantly in the presence of students. The teachers should uphold the ideals of their profession: The ideals they inculcate in their students should be their own.

A. Teachers and their responsibilities

- 1. A Teacher should be calm, patient, easy to approach and able to communicate effectively.
- 2. Perform his/her duties of teaching with dedication.
- 3. Carry out other miscellaneous duties like admissions, counseling of students, evaluation of scripts,
- 4. Participate in extension, co-curricular and extracurricular activities including community service.

B. Teachers and the students

Teachers should

- 1. Give freedom to students to express themselves, respect their rights and dignity.
- 2. Always be impartial and just, regardless of the caste, color, creed, social and economic status of
- 3. Pay individual attention to students and deal with them according to their special needs.
- 4. Encourage students to realize their potential and teach them to contribute to the welfare of their
- 5. Inculcate the spirit of patriotism, democracy and peace among the students. Teach them the dignity of labour and importance of physical work.
- 6. Always be affectionate towards students and never be vindictive.
- 7. Be available to students even beyond teaching hours. Help them without expecting any
- 8. Make students aware of the rich cultural heritage of the nation. Inculcate in them a sense of pride for their country.

C. Teachers and the society

Teachers should

- 1. Recognize that teaching is a public service and keep the public appraised about the education which
- 2. Strive to provide education to the community and improve their moral and intellectual life.
- 3. Refrain from taking part in activities which lead to hatred, enmity, and violence among various communities, religions or linguistic groups.
- Work actively for National Integration.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS **Conduct and Discipline**

The Principal can impose fine, suspend or even rusticate any student who is found indulging in such misconduct as is listed below. Indiscipline on campus will not be tolerated.

- 1 (i) Any act of ragging in or around the campus will be severely dealt with as per Govt. norms. Ragging implies harassment/ physical or mental torture to another student by a student or a group of students. Any student found associated in such nefarious activities will be held guilty of gross misconduct. Remember Ragging is a cognizable offence.
- (ii) Any body found guilty of writing obscene language words on blackboard, walls or furniture of the
- (iii) Aimlessly loitering in the verandas, making noise or attempting to disturb classes.
- (iv) Smoking or consumption of alcohol/drugs etc. in the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- (v) Bringing unwanted outsider persons to the campus or sitting unnecessary on the passage to the campus or within campus.
- (vi) Pasting posters on the walls or notices on the Notice Board without Principal's permission.
- (viii) Mobile phone should be on switch off mode in classes and on silent mode outside classes/college campus. Violation of rule would lead to fine Rs. 100/-
- 2. Student who participates in sports or other co-curricular and extra -curricular activities /educational tours must produce written permission from their parents/guardians.
- 3. Every student must always carry with him/her duly completed identity card which is issued to him/her at the time of admission. He/she must produce the identity card when ever demanded by any teacher or
- 4. Parents/guardians are requested to remain in touch with the Principal and the concerned teachers regarding the progress, punctuality and discipline of their wards in the college.

ANTI-RAGGING/INDISCIPLINE RULES

In order to have zero tolerance and its total elimination from the educational institutions, Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its orders dated 4th may, 2001: 16th May, 2007 and 11th Feb. 2009 has directed are here as under:

1. Ragging is banned in the institution.

- 2. Any indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be exemplary and justifiably harsh.
- 3. Punishment for ragging includes:

Imprisonment, fine or both.

Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited (ii) period or fine with a public apology

Withholding scholarship or other benefits (iii)

Debarring from representation in events. (iv)

Withholding of results.

- 4. If the individuals committing or abetting ragging are not identified, collective punishment shall be
- 5. Character/ Migration certificates (s) issued by the institution shall have an entry part from that of general conduct and behavior to the effect whether the student had participated in ragging and in particular was punished for ragging.

6. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging / indiscipline in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she has indulged is ragging, his/her admission may be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the institution forthwith.
