Being the coordinator of this cell I have focussed on women issues and tried to sensitize students over the years through various awareness programmes. By addressing inequality in terms of opportunity and access the society can be sanitized for behavioural changes thus becoming more responsible. Education in real sense instills the quality of understanding and differentiating between right and wrong; injustice and other evils prevailing in a society. But why do we need to talk about women and why there is a necessity of creating such bodies like women empowerment or sexual harassment and grievance redressal cells in colleges or state commission for women? Do we really need them?

The answer is yes.....

In view of growing criminal offences against women especially in a hill state like Himachal which has an image of a very cool and calm state, we need to talk about gender sensitivity.

Global facts also reflect biasedness' against women as they are more illiterate, more poor, earn less and own less property. The scenario for India and Himachal Pradesh is... that the government has put more efforts on girls' education by making it free, allocating various scholarships, providing free books and uniforms, running various schemes for females like self-employment, marriage grant, *balika samridhi yogna*, *Kishori shakti yogna* etc. These various schemes must have contributed to the higher status of women.

But despite this it seems that females are being discriminated if we deeply study about two indicators i.e., sex ratio and work participation which has not been found in their favour. It is seen that women remain silent about the abuses and harassment at home and work places despite being highly educated.

UNDP focuses on gender equality and women empowerment not only as human rights, but also because they are a pathway to achieving the Millennium Development Goals and sustainable development.

In India From the Fifth Five Year Plan (1974-78) onwards there is a marked shift in the approach to women's issues i.e., from **welfare to development.** 

- The principle of gender equality is enshrined in the Indian Constitution in its Preamble, Fundamental Rights, Fundamental Duties and Directive Principles. The Constitution not only grants equality to women, but also empowers the State to adopt measures against any discrimination.
- The National Commission for Women was set up by an Act of Parliament in 1990 to safeguard the rights and legal entitlements of women.
- The 73<sup>rd</sup> and 74<sup>th</sup> Amendments (1993) to the Constitution of India have provided for reservation of seats in the local bodies of Panchayats and Municipalities for women, laying a strong foundation for their participation in decision making at the local levels. These are certain measures a good sign towards women empowerment.

This was understood all over the globe that **women empowerment lies in gender equality** Meaning equal rights, opportunities, distribution of power, financial independence, equal access to education and the opportunity to develop personal ambitions.

When we talk about GDC Banjar we feel proud that women are more empowered as is reflected by the strength of the college which is increasing year after year with girls overpowering boys not only in number but also in academics. CSCA comprises of more than ninety percent girls as can be seen in the photograph below.

### **Activities 2016-2017**

#### Special lecture on Anti Ragging




## **Activities 2020-2021**
